Dukeries Motor Club would like to invite you to participate in the **RAINWORTH SKODA Dukeries Rally** at Donington Park on Sunday 13th October 2019. **This will be the 60th consecutive year of the Dukeries Rally.**

This will be RAINWORTH SKODA's 16th consecutive year of sponsoring this event and Dukeries Motor Club are extremely grateful for this continued support which hopefully reflects the popularity of previous events and the attraction of running a stage rally at Donington Park, the heart of British motorsport.

1. ANNOUNCEMENT

Dukeries Motor Club Ltd. will organise a NATIONAL 'B' permit Single Venue Stage Rally on Sunday 13th October 2019, to be known as the **RAINWORTH SKODA DUKERIES RALLY.**

The event will be a qualifying round of the following rally championships: -

Wemix Concrete Ltd EMAMC Stage Rally Championship
Roadrunner/Phoenix Awards ANEMMC Stage Rally Championship
Jelfmotorsport.com AEMC/ASEMC Stage Rally Championship
CMSGCC Stage Rally Championship
Dukeries Motor Club Rally Championship

2. JURISDICTION

The events will be governed by the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the F.I.A.), these Supplementary Regulations (SR's) and any written instructions the promoting club may issue.

3. AUTHORISATION

4. ELIGIBILITY

The events are open to all members of the promoting club, registered contenders in the rally championships for which this is a qualifying round and members of motor clubs which are members of the: -

- East Midlands Association of Motor Clubs
- Association of North East Midlands Motor Clubs
- Association of West Midland Motor Clubs (which includes CMSG clubs and the BTRDA)
- Association of Eastern Motor Clubs

All competitors must hold a Motorsport UK Competition Licence of National 'B' status or above. Drivers licence must be for Stage Rallies. All Cars must comply with Motorsport UK Safety and Technical Regulations for Special Stage Rallies.

5. FORMAT

The event will be held entirely within the confines of Donington Park Race Circuit off Melbourne Rd, Islay Walton, Derbyshire. DE74 2RN. Map Ref:129/196.254.

The event will contain 8 stages providing 60 stage miles (100% asphalt).

The first car will start at 09.20 and the last car will finish at around 17.30.

6. CLASSES

- Class 1 Cars up to and including 1400 cc
- Class 2 Cars over 1400cc up to and including 1600 cc
- Class 3 Cars over 1600cc up to and including 2000 cc
- Class 4 2-wheel drive cars over 2000cc
- Class 5 4-wheel drive cars over 2000 cc

All forced induction and rotary engine cars are subject to an additional capacity ratio of 1 to 1.7

7. ENTRIES

Entries open at 8pm on Friday 23rd August and close for seeding purposes only on Thursday 3rd October. If places remain, entries will be accepted up to the closing date of Wednesday 9th October, but they will NOT be included in the official programme etc. The maximum number of entries will be 80 and the minimum is 50. The organisers may reserve up to 5 additional entries to allocate at their discretion.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry.

Entries must be submitted via the on-line entry system and must be accompanied by the entry fee of £300, paid by Bank Transfer. Please supply all crew and car details when submitting the entry. (Motorsport UK specifically require the competition licence number and address of ever competitor)

The Entry Fee includes 6 admission e-tickets, free 9" competition numbers, a rally plate plus a 60th anniversary souvenir programme and badge for each crew member.

All entries will be acknowledged but will not be included in the list of 'accepted' entries until payment has been received. NB: The initial list of 'accepted' entries will not be published until the initial payments have been processed which may take up to 48 hours.

Entries withdrawn in writing / e-mail up to Wed 2^{nd} October will be refunded less £10. Entries withdrawn in writing / e-mail after Wed 2^{nd} October will be refunded less £20.

The starting order will be decided by a Seeding Committee using performance information from various sources including that provided by the competitor on the entry form. Correspondence or discussion will NOT be entered into regarding the decisions of the Seeding Committee.

8. NOISE TEST & SCRUTINEERING

The Noise Test & Scrutineering will be held adjacent to the Scrutineering Bay in Paddock 2 on Saturday 12th October from 14.30 to 18.30 only. Cars must comply with Motorsport UK Safety and Technical regulations. Cars will also be checked to ensure they carry a spare wheel and the means of changing it. (or sign a damage waiver) In-car cameras are permitted but they MUST be in place when the car is scrutineered.

Cars do not need to be taxed or insured for the public highway but vehicle registration documents and current MOT (where applicable) must be available for inspection along with the appropriate Motorsport UK CCLB / vehicle passport.

9. DOCUMENTATION

Final Instructions will be published on the event website and e-mailed to competitors on Sunday 6th October.

Documentation will take place in the Pit Lane Suite located at the back of Garage 39^h on Saturday 12^{th} October from 14.30 to 18.45 and on Sunday 13^{th} October from 08.00 to 08.30, where a check on competitors' competition licences and club membership cards will be made. Competitors who do not meet the club membership criteria may join Dukeries Motor Club at the cost of £15 (till Dec 2020). Competitors who have not signed on 60 mins before their due start time may be deemed to be non-starters and their entry awarded to a reserve. On completion of documentation crews will be supplied with Time Cards and Stage Plans.

The Official Notice Board will be located in the Pit lane Suite throughout the event. Before, during and after the competition, official notices may be displayed, and every competitor shall be deemed to have read all such notices and if applicable they shall have the same force as these SR's and shall be binding upon competitors. Due times at ATC1 will be displayed on the Official Notice Board from 14.30 on Saturday 12th October.

10. VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION

Each car will be identified by 9" high black competition numbers which will be supplied by CJ Rallying on behalf of the event. All identification must be kept in a legible condition throughout the event. The event will supply 2 sponsor decals which must be affixed to each side of the car above the competition number. The event Rally Plate should be fixed to the rear window or on the boot so that it can be seen from the rear.

11. TIMING AND CONTROLS

This is a Target Timed event. Apart from the due time at MTC1 (Stage 1 Arrival), all other due times at ATC's will be issued to competitors at the Passage Control following the finish of the preceding stage. The organisers will automatically allow for any delays when allocating these due times.

Competitors may be required to reduce lateness in accordance with R32.1.1 and in the event of any retirement's competitors will be required to close up gaps.

Maximum Permitted Lateness (penalty free) will be **5 minutes**. (R31.2.5 & R.31.2.6)

Controls will open at the due time of Car 1 and will close 5 minutes after the due time of the last competing car (after allowing for their Maximum Permitted Lateness)

The organisers times and mileages will be deemed correct and not subject to protest. Any adjustments caused by a timekeeping error must be made at the control in question. Should any recorded time not be legible or appear authentic the organisers may use any means available to establish an appropriate time.

Special Stage Start Control (R25.7.2)

Stages may be started at intervals of less than one minute. (30 second starts)

The starting signal for the Stages will be controlled by automatic timing equipment utilising jump start beams and clock operated traffic lights displaying the following starting procedure. There will be **no** verbal countdown. At **15 seconds** before your start time a **RED** light will be shown.

At **10 seconds** before your start time an **AMBER** light will be come on.

At **5 seconds** before your start time the **RED** light will go off and the 5 sectors of the **AMBER** light will turn off at 4, 3, 2, 1 seconds before your start time.

At your **start time,** the final sector of the **AMBER** will turn off and a **GREEN** light will be shown. The **GREEN** light will be the visual signal to **GO**.

False starts will be penalised in accordance with R32.2(e)

The organisers reserve the right to change to a manual system as referred to in R25.7 to R25.8.2 at any time should the automatic system fail.

Please note there will be **NO** '30 seconds to go' advance warning issued in either start procedure.

Passage Controls (PC's)

A PC will be established after each stage to collect time cards and issue subsequent ATC times

Force majeure notwithstanding, the organisers reserve the right to delete any section of the event from the results if they deem it fairer to do so. Alternatively, they may apply R24.5 as appropriate.

12. STAGE ROUTE / SHORTCUTTING

The onus is on the competitors to follow the correct stage route as set out in the stage plans and as defined by direction arrows and other stage furniture. Chicanes, split junctions and merges will be used, and these must be negotiated correctly.

Shortcutting is defined as: -

- Driving the competing car off the stage route which may be defined by road cones, tyres or other barriers, and in doing so driving a route which is not as the organisers proscribed. (whether longer or shorter)
- Where one or more wheel of the competing car is in contact with cultivated land at either side of the stage route.

Chicanes: The stage routes will include a number of chicanes to reduce the speed of the cars at certain points. Striking the robust tyre barriers will damage your vehicle but will also INCUR A TIME PENALTY should the tyre barriers be moved from their original position. Marshals at these locations are deemed to be a Judge of Fact and will record and report on these instances. If a barrier requires repositioning after being moved by your rally car, you will incur the following time penalties:

- 1st occasion 30 seconds
- 2nd and all subsequent occasions 60 seconds

Punctures / Flat Tyres: Like any race circuit, Donington Park is very concerned that there should be no damage to the track surface. **If you have a puncture you must STOP immediately and change it; do NOT continue. Any competitor driving on a punctured tyre will be EXCLUDED.**

Any damage caused to the track surface and the costs incurred will be the responsibility of the competitor.

13. PENALTIES

As specified in the Motorsport UK Yearbook R32.1 and chart 32.2. In addition: -

Completing less than the required number of laps
 Completing more than the required number of laps
 Stage Maximum
 Time Taken

Reversing or turning around and returning to a stage split point

or cutting across after the split point Exclusion

Not performing a stage correctly or not completing a stage
 Shortcutting on a Stage (see SR 12)
 Stage Maximum
 1 minute per occasion

Running with a flat tyre on the stage (see SR 12)
 Exclusion

• Not reporting at a stage or reporting OTL. R32.2(a) 30mins per occasion

To be classified as a finisher, a crew must have completed two-thirds of the stages and reported to the final control within maximum lateness, in the car in which they started.

A competitor who misses a stage MUST report to Rally HQ where they may be given a restart time for the next available stage, subject to a Scrutineers inspection of the vehicle.

14. JUDGES OF FACT

All named Officials are Judges of Fact to observe and report on any breaches of Regulations. Stage Start marshals are empowered to judge if a competitor has made a false start. Additional Judges of Fact will be listed on the Official Notice Board.

15. STAGE SAFETY

In accordance with R25.4 to R25.4.9, all competing vehicles must carry an OK / SOS board and in the event of an accident where urgent medical attention is required the SOS board must be displayed to the following competitors. In the event of an accident or breakdown where medical assistance is not required the OK board must be displayed.

Each competing car must carry a Red Warning Triangle, which in the event of a car stopping on a special stage, must be placed in a conspicuous position by a member of the crew, at least 50m before the cars position to warn following crews. This triangle must be placed even if the stopped car is off the road.

Broken or damaged cars will only be recovered from the stages by official Motorsport UK licenced recovery vehicles on the direct instructions of senior event officials after stages 2, 4, 6 and 8.

16. SERVICING

Servicing will only be permitted in the designated Service Area in Paddock 1 and Paddock 2. All work carried out in the Service Area should comply with Health & Safety recommendations and the Motorsport UK Service Area Risk Management document. Water is available and there is a 24-hour Fuel Station on site; payment by card only.

When any work is carried out on a competing car in the Service Area it must be parked on a non-porous groundsheet. Strictly no litter of any sort must be left on-site.

The behaviour of the Service Crew is the responsibility of the competing crew.

Each competing car will be allowed one service vehicle in the Service Area (Paddocks 1 and 2) Trailers, Towing vehicles and Motorhomes (if different from the Service Vehicle) must be left in the adjacent Paddock 3 once unloaded. Other vehicles can be parked in the Spectator car park just outside the main gate.

Pit Lane Garages

There are 34 garage spaces available for hire during the event. Each garage space has a 3.3 m wide roller door opening up to an internal width of more than 4m and has power and water. They are arranged in pairs and open inside which will be ideal for a two-car team but can easily be shared by two separate crews. [The organisers will do their best to pair up teams that want to service together in adjacent garages].

The cost is £40 for a single garage space. The garages will be allocated on a first come first served basis and must be ordered and paid for via the web entry system when submitting your entry. NB: Access to the garages will not be until 16.30 on Saturday.

17. PERMITTED FUEL

Competitors are only permitted to use fuel that conforms to the definition of Pump Fuel in the 2019 Motorsport UK Yearbook. Additives are NOT permitted unless specified in that definition of Pump Fuel.

REFUELLING: Competitors are encouraged to use the Donington **on-site self-service petrol station** located between Paddocks 1 and 2 which supplies super unleaded fuel. Payment by credit card only. Self-refuelling is permitted in the Service Area but NOT in the Garages.

- 1. Refuelling **must** be the last operation carried out before the vehicle leaves. All other work must have ceased **and there must be no occupants in the vehicle whilst refuelling takes place**.
- 2. All sources of ignition must be removed from the area and an appropriate fire response prepared.
- 3. Re-fuelling should be using a suitable hand pump and NOT by pouring fuel from hand-held containers.
- 4. Fuel containers should comply with the relevant British Standard, should be marked "Petroleum Spirit-Highly Flammable" and be kept away from any source of ignition.
- 5. All empty containers should be removed from the venue after the event.
- 6. All vehicle re-fuelling is to take place in the open air. Smoking and any other sources of ignition, including live electrical items, must be prohibited and a safe area should be enforced with an operative on standby with a fire extinguisher.
- 7. Refuelling operatives, including those standing by with fire extinguishers, should ensure they are wearing protective clothing, including gloves and eye protection.

18. DAMAGE DECLARATION

At the finish of the event, all crews must complete and sign a declaration to the effect that they have not been involved in any incident that may have caused damage to persons or property, or alternatively give details of such incidents. Failure to comply will be penalised under R40.1.3 and R40.1.4. Failure to complete and return this form at the end of the event (or within 72hrs of the end of the event) may be penalised by a fine of up to £100.

The Motorsport UK master insurance policies are described in Appendix 2 of the Motorsport UK Yearbook. Please note that these policies do not cover damage to safety barriers, marshal's posts, other course installations or the road surface. Where the damage is covered by the Motorsport UK insurance policy, the competitor may still be liable for any insurance excess that Dukeries MC must pay, which is currently £425.

19. RESULTS & AWARDS PRESENTATION

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the conclusion of the event and if no protests are received, they will become final after 30mins. The presentation of awards will take place as soon as the results are made final. Every winning competitor must be present to receive their award otherwise the award may be withheld, but without affecting the final result.

First Overall Driver: The Rod Clarke Trophy and an award First Overall Co Driver: The Iris Kellett Trophy and an award

Second Overall Driver: Clipstone Cup and an award

(To qualify for a Dukeries Motor Club award you must be a member on 1st August 2019)

Named trophies may be held for up to 9 months but remain the property of Dukeries Motor Club Ltd. Competitors are responsible for ensuring that any trophies are returned safely and assume responsibility for any loss or damage sustained in transit.

21. SPECIFIC REGULATIONS for DONINGTON PARK

ACCESS to the **VENUE**:

ALL competitors, support crew and spectators will need an e-ticket to enter the venue on Saturday or Sunday. As part of the event entry, each crew will be supplied with a maximum of 6 e-tickets. These will be e-mailed via the MSV ticketing system to the person nominated on the entry form 7 days before the event.

Additional tickets can be bought on-line in advance via the Donington MSV ticket website or purchased at the gate on the day of the event. These tickets give pedestrian access to the Service Area and all the Spectator Areas. Any additional vehicles must park in the spectator car parks outside the entry gate.

NOISE CURFEW:

It is a strict condition of use that ALL competitors must abide by the Donington Park Noise Regulations.

There must be NO starting or running of ANY competition engine between 19.00 on Saturday 12th October and 9.00am on Sunday 13th October. Any violation for whatever reason will mean exclusion from the event and will put at risk any future rallies at this venue.

OVERNIGHT PARKING:

Crews are welcome to stay overnight at the venue which has 24hr security. Motorhomes, caravans and tents are permitted in Paddock 3 where there are toilets, showers and washing facilities, but not in the adjacent Paddocks 1 & 2 which are only for competition cars and service vehicles. There is NO camping or motorhomes permitted overnight in the spectator car parks outside the circuit.

QUADBIKES/MOTORBIKES/DRONES:

Any person found using any Quadbike, Moped, Motorbike or Scooter in the Service Area, or flying a drone anywhere within the circuit, will be excluded from the event and removed from the venue.

ANIMALS:

NO animals / pets are allowed in the venue. Any person bringing animals into Donington Park will be excluded from the event and removed from the venue.

HOSPITALITY:

Donington Park has a wide range of hospitality options available.
